The first Casting Directors to win Australia's **<u>B&T 30 under 30 Award</u>**, Alison Fowler and Stephanie Pringle are Australia's next generation of casting.

With credits spanning across independent film and network television and 20 years of experience between them under their belts; some of which include AACTA nominated film Miro (directed by Victoria Wharfe McIntyre), network comedy Metro Sexual for Channel Nine, Stargazing for the BBC, Chlorine (directed by Melissa Anastasi) and Deluge (directed by Cloudy Rhodes) both produced by Dollhouse Pictures and both having a successful international festival run.

Feature films include Ellie & Abbie (and Ellie's Dead Aunt) directed by Monica Zanetti and having received glowing reviews of the up and coming and international cast ensemble that includes Rachel House. Ellie & Abbie was the first Australian Feature Film to open the Mardi Gras Film Festival in the program's 27 year history. Pioneer film The Flood directed by Victoria Wharfe McIntyre will get it's theatrical release in 2020. Deadhouse Dark Anthology (2020) produced by showrunner Enzo Tedeschi is Australia's only successful entry into Canneseries 2020.
