CinefestOZ Film Prize

For the sixth time, the \$100,000 CinefestOZ Film Prize will be awarded to the producer of an Australian feature film. This year there are five titles in the running – *GO!, H is for Happiness, Hearts and Bones, Judy & Punch* and *Measure for Measure*.

The winner will be decided by a jury of esteemed members of the film industry, headed this year by Rachel Ward and announced at CinefestOZ's Gala Night on Saturday, 31 August.

The films received each year are not only incredible Australian films, they are also worthy of international recognition and CinefestOZ is proud to present these films at the festival.

The \$100,000 Film Prize, which is made possible with support from the State Government through Tourism WA's Regional Events Program, was established to encourage excellence in Australian filmmaking, support the nation's vibrant film industry and attract new audiences to Australian film.

Each year CinefestOZ holds a short film competition for South West students, aged 15-18 yrs. The annual project encourages young aspiring creators of film and digital content to work to a theme and produce a short film.

Seven finalist films are then screened before a large audience at the Grand Finale, a red carpet youth event where they receive industry feedback and a winner is announced.

The competition launches in December, and closes at the end of June.

"The Cinesnaps Schools Program creates unique opportunities for young people across the South West through sharing the latest filmmaking technologies and skills, as well as providing access to industry professionals. 


