In Film distribution is changing rapidly amid COVID-19 with recent announcements of major distribution plans tied to streaming, film release dates tentative and cinemas in tricky positions.

While many films have navigated constant changes with theatrical releases, there is no shortage of great Australian films. On the back of an interesting 2020, films including *The Dry* (#15), *The Invisible Man* (#38), *Penguin Bloom* (#58) and *Rams* (#78) rose to the top of the100 all-time Aussie films.
