Gala mabu gurrburlan. gun-gabungany, banugabungany, gularrgabungany, yalmbangabungany. We welcome all our visitors who are here today coming from the north, east, west and south of Australia, Gala wirriva vangarrngaran junggarra liyan nyambagun buru, javida Rubibiyi, We are grateful that you are here in our country, as visitors. Nyamba buru jayida Yawurungany ngarrungunil bugarrigarranyurdany, iarrinyoun buru mangara. This is land of the Yawuru people from the Dreamtime, always and forever. Miliya rumarragun wirriya yangarrngaran ngangayi LIYAN jarrayirr yanggibardu yanggi yingarrjin. We are proud of our Yawuru language as we welcome and feel a new day dawning.

Inspired by actual events, MURU is the story of a local Police Sergeant 'Taffy' Tāwharau (Cliff Curtis), who must choose between duty to his badge or his people, when the Government invoke antiterrorism powers to launch an armed raid on Taffy's remote Urewera community, on a school day. This gripping action drama is not a re-creation, but a response to the 2007 Tūhoe raids. MURU is a Māori concept for 'forgiveness'.



In this screening we will meet Noonuccal poet Oodgeroo Noonuccal (formerly Kath Walker) – the first Aborignal woman to publish a book of verse as well as Birri Gubba Gungalu media innovator and radio host, Tiga Bayles who was one of the driving forces behind the establishment of Radio Redfern, and later a formative influence on 4AAA in Brisbane as well as The Murri School.
